





Sunny Side of the Doc 2020: the Connected Edition Award Winners

The Connected Edition of Sunny Side of the Doc and PiXii Festival, which took place online from 22nd to 25th June 2020, has revealed its award winners live during its awards ceremony.

La Rochelle, 25th June 2020 – The Connected Edition of Sunny Side of the Doc and PiXii Festival is now coming to a close. This year's edition was broadcast via the platform <u>connected.sunnysideofthedoc.com</u> and was met with astounding success, as more than 1,700 accredited industry professionals from more than 60 different countries took part. The Connected Edition platform (with the video library) registered near 100.000 viewed pages.

Amongst the 950 companies taking part, many were able to host one of 350 stands and pavilions at the virtual marketplace.

The Connected Edition's programme featured a mixture of pre-recorded conferences, interactive sessions held live or with a chat interface, an online screening library and networking activities. This enabled numerous delegations of producers to gather together in force, with participants coming from: Canada, USA, Germany, Italy and Spain, as well as territories that would rarely or even never come to La Rochelle, such as Kenya, and several Latin American (Argentina, Chili, Brazil, etc.) and Central and Eastern Europe (Serbia, Bulgaria, Ukraine...) countries.



"It's an excellent result for our first Connected Edition which has been able to bring together the documentary community from around the world. We would like to give a warm thank you to all industry delegates taking part, for their agility and collective commitment towards this digital adventure," comments Mathieu Béjot, director of Strategy and Development. "For the very first time, the ratio of French to international accredited industry delegates is equal at 50/50, which gives us material to think about the global reach an online event can have."

Reducing the price for accreditation and entry fees for projects and programme undeniably had an impact on the number of documentaries submitted.

With 1,360 projects and programmes to explore via the online screening library (+134% compared to 2019), the Connected Edition has been able to respond to the demand for documentary content with international potential.



"After the health crisis and lockdown which we have all faced, this is a strong signal which highlights the crucial need for new documentary productions for television channels and platforms," remarks Mathieu Béjot.

The networking opportunities for industry professionals were one of the Connected Edition's main attractions. Initial feedback underlines just how relevant the initiative was: almost 400 accredited international decision-makers (buyers, heads of programming and cultural stakeholders), more than 250 meetings organised as part of the Meet The Experts consultations, 215 private one-to-one meetings for projects selected in the Pitching Sessions, and 140 meetings organised between producers for the Italian delegation matchmaking session, supported by Italian Trade Agency.

PiXii Festival also went digital, providing exposure to immersive experiences (AR, VR, 360°, binaural sound and physical installations) from the Official Selection, with video pitches created especially by project holders to get around the lack of physical showroom in La Rochelle. "These pitch presentations are real assets for the creative teams, as they'll be able to use them for other purposes once the Connected Edition is over," points out Stéphane Malagnac, Development Executive of PiXii.

For its 4th edition, the international festival of digital cultures continued to go global with projects coming from Israel, Denmark, Singapore, Poland, Australia and Canada.

These pitch videos will also be available free to watch on the Sunny Side of the Doc website as of the 1st July. This shall enable producers to continue their exchanges with cultural operators, who this year came from 15 different countries: South Africa, Germany, Argentina, Belgium, Canada, China, Denmark, USA, France, Israel, New Zealand, The Netherlands, the UK, Sweden and Switzerland.



"This year's Connected Edition has enabled us to offer new opportunities for exchange. This undeniably opens up the perspectives as to how a part of our online marketplace activities shall be run for the 2021 edition - for which a proportion remains to be defined, as well as creating new meet-ups throughout the year," continues Mathieu Béjot.



"This year, we fixed ourselves the objective of continuing the fight for the documentary genre while reinventing Sunny Side of the Doc. We are obviously incredibly delighted and eager to host the festival once again in La Rochelle next June, together with all industry professionals," concludes Roman Jeanneau, CEO of the organisation. "Yves used to say, and we all thought the same, that 'As much as the documentary genre must be recognised as a public entity, Sunny Side of the Doc is necessary and vital to the documentary genre.""

The platform <u>connected.sunnysideofthedoc.com</u> is open to accredited delegates until 30th June 2020. From the 1st of July, all projects and programs as well as conference and round tables replays will be available (for accredited professionals) via <u>www.sunnysideofthedoc.com</u> until September 30, 2020. The Pitch Sessions are available until 30th June 2020.

The 32nd edition of Sunny Side of the Doc and the 5th edition of PiXii Festival will take place on 21st to 24th June 2021 with a Focus on Documentary Co-productions with Central and Eastern Europe.




